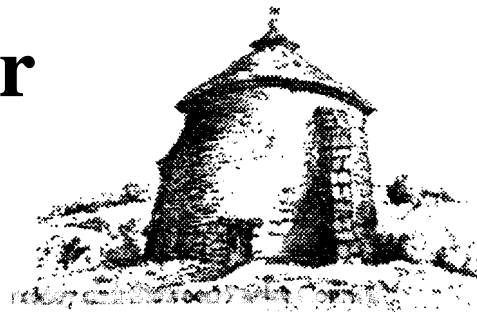

### **BECKLEY VILLAGE HALL**

Villagers will be aware that last year the committee was obliged to undertake major repairs to our village hall which cost in excess of £5,000. This has made the hall safe for a few years but a number of you will be aware that it was built in 1981 out of reclaimed materials, mostly timber, which has a limited lifespan.

With this in mind the committee have spent some time considering our options. We have decided that we have to look to the future and to make plans for the replacement of our hall. A group of us are organising visits to other new village halls in the county in order we can draw upon their experiences.

It is our intention to draw up some draft proposals which we will place before all villagers at an open meeting when everyone will have an opportunity to share their thoughts.

At present we do not have a budget as this will depend on the size of the proposed new hall, the type of materials and the quality. Our Parish Council have set aside a substantial contribution from the sale of Constable's Piece and the school have indicated that they would wish to be part of the fund raising group. ## RECIPE FOR SPRING KIPPER KEDGEREE

(A good way to boost your Omega 2 intake)

Method:

Cook the rice in a sauce pan with 1 pint salted water until soft, adding water as necessary. Cook the Boil in Bag Kipper as instructions in a shallow pan (with a fitted lid for further use). Peel and slice the apple and onion. When the rice and kipper are ready, mix them in the pan with all the other ingredients and cook gently for about 15 to 20 minutes stirring and adding water as necessary. It is better if the lid is used to prevent loss of moisture. When cooked serve with suitable vegetables. **Frank Ratford 351271**

## A WOMAN FOR ALL SEASONS

There she goes - rain or shine. Up hill and down dale. Walking. Walking. Except when she is taking her turn to clean the church, shaking the tin at various stores and rest stops for the County Alzheimer's Committee, serving tea and cake at the John Ratcliffe each Wednesday morning as a member of Friends of the JR, delivering the Beckley newsletter, hosting her grandchildren, or running Garage, Car Boot Sales, and Coffee Mornings to raise funds for her forthcoming trip to the Inca Trail.

Dorrie Gething, 20 year resident of Beckley, native of County Wexford, Ireland, a force to be reckoned with and a blessing to know. Dorrie and her husband Doug were children together in County Wexford, married, began a family, and moved to Oxford in 1960 for Doug to work as a mechanic, first at the car factory, and then for himself. In 1975 they came to Beckley, where Dorrie's three children attended Beckley School and Dorrie was wife, mother, school, church, and community volunteer.

Five years ago Doug was diagnosed with Alzheimer's and for the next few years Dorrie became his principal care-giver. In 2005 Doug passed away and Dorrie entered what she labeled her 'gap' year.... travelling alone or with friends to places all over the world.

Dorrie continued her involvement with the local community and eventually developed the dream of participating in the Alzheimer's Society's Trek to Peru and the Inca Trail to raise funds and public awareness of the need for support and research for people with Alzheimer's and their carers. In order to participate, Dorrie has opted to pay her own way and turn everything she raises in sponsorships over to the Society.

Dorrie is scheduled for the Trek in the spring, but her training plan began months ago. 'Even if you walk regularly', says the Trek Training Guide,

‘and have a good level of fitness, you will still need to train for this type of long-distance walking.’ Companions on her training walks have included her dog Rollo, the Wellers, the Radio Oxford group, and a group from Wheatley.

The trek will involve 31 people walking five 8-10 hour days along the Inca Trail with ‘lots of steps’ and altitudes up to 3700m. Local guides will carry their sleeping bags, tents, and food. At a meeting of participants in London, most seemed younger than Dorrie – some in their 20s – but all with a history of someone in their family having had Alzheimer’s.

### FROM THE VICAR

As well as going into Beckley school regularly, we have started a monthly school service in church. At Christmas the younger pupils did their nativity play in church and the older pupils held a carol service. We were all impressed by the way they learnt the Bible readings by heart.

**23<sup>rd</sup> March Easter Sunday** – There will be a Sunrise Service starting outside the church at 6.00am. At 9.30am there will be the usual Easter Celebration
